OSU-Tulsa Staff Advisory Council Minutes

1. Administration Update – Karen Castle

- OSU Tulsa will be hosting the Northeast Oklahoma Legislative Tour on January 21st in the Helmerich Research Center. It is an annual meeting with area legislators, OSU A&M Board of Regents and University Presidents. The Chancellor will give a legislative update at the reception/lunch.
- President Fry has been meeting with over 50 individuals in a wide variety of capacities since July to further OSU Tulsa's positive involvement in the community and surrounding areas.
- She has also become involved in the Tulsa Chamber and will be joining their board in January.
- She attended a special session of The Association of Public and Land Grand Universities in San Diego earlier this month.
- Dr. Fry is also interested in conducting more small-group meetings with the staff and faculty of OSU Tulsa to continue gathering ideas and input.

2. Fun Facts – ahha Tulsa with Lauren Teague Collins

Lauren Teague Collins, Director of Communications, shared with us a brief history of ahha Tulsa and their presence in the Tulsa community. Originally named the Arts & Humanities Council of Tulsa, ahha was founded in 1961 with the mission to cultivate a more creative Tulsa. In 2012, the Hardesty Center was opened in the Tulsa Arts District. The center has 3 floors that are open to the public:

- The Gallery
- The Experience
- The Studio

The center offers a variety of camps, classes, and partners with Any Given Child-Tulsa to provide access to arts education for K-8 students in the Tulsa Public School system. ahha Tulsa partners with 13 other organizations to provide these opportunities to students.

Their hours of operations are Wednesday-Saturday 12:00pm-9:00pm and Sunday 12:00pm-7:00pm. Admission for Adults is \$12.75, children 3-12 is \$8.75, children under 3 are free.

- Candace Jackson and Tom Thorisch in the Library were excited to announce the installation of work cubicles for the library staff members as they continue to operate in their temporary location.
- Danielle Roper informed members of the council that Career Services will be providing free coffee and tea as well as chair massages to students during pre-finals week. The Wellness Center is also going to begin offering 20-minute dance classes once a month.
- Alicia McClendon announced we will be participating again in the MLK Day parade on January 20th, 2020. The Center for Poets and Writers has also posted new workshops available. 6. Report from OSU-STW SAC meeting – Karen Castle

Karen Castle, Annette Morey, and Olivia Woody represented OSU-Tulsa the Stillwater SAC meeting on November 13th. One of the highlights of the meeting was a short presentation of Active Shooter Training on the Stillwater campus. This came in conjunction with last month's reports of gunfire in the Edmon Low Library. Officers were on scene within one minute and had the situation under control within 5 minutes. Stillwater is developing an Active Shooter Training video specific to Stillwater Campus. They will be posting it to the OSU-STW Police Department website when it is completed. They encourage all faculty, staff, and students to complete some sort of active shooter training. Currently, the College of Human Sciences is the only college to incorporate such training in their freshman orientation.
